

Admission Information

As HopeWay is a voluntary, unlocked facility, applicants are admitted to the residential and day treatment programs on a voluntary basis. Applicants must be willing and able to participate positively and fully in treatment, including group activities. HopeWay welcomes self and family referrals, as well as referrals from mental health organizations, providers, hospitals, and/or the community.

CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

Applicants seeking admission to HopeWay, must be 18 years of age or older, and have a primary mental health diagnosis including, but not limited to:

- Anxiety Disorders
- Depressive Disorders
- Bipolar and Related Disorders
- Schizophrenia Spectrum and Other Psychotic Disorders

- Trauma and Stress Related Disorders
- Substance Use Disorders with a Co-Occurring Mental Health Diagnosis
- Sleep-Wake Disorders
- Complex Co-Occurring Disorder

EXCLUSIONARY CRITERIA

Applicants seeking admission to HopeWay will not be admitted if the following are present:

- acute medical needs that cannot be managed outside of a hospital setting;
- the need for medical detoxification from alcohol, prescription and/or illicit substances
- the need for psychiatric hospitalization due to having active suicidal or homicidal ideation or behavior(s);
- individual is under a criminal court order for treatment;
- individual has a history of recent or ongoing violent behavior towards oneself, others or property;
- individual is in need of a forensic treatment setting;
- individual has a history of sexually perpetrating others or is a registered sexual offender;
- predominate diagnosis: substance use disorder, intellectual disability, eating disorder requiring medical attention, and/or antisocial personality disorder.
